Wreaths are placed on grave markers at state and national Veterans cemeteries, as well as at local and communities cemeteries each December for National Wreaths Across America Day. This year, the Wreaths Across America ceremony is December 16th, at 11:00 am. Each wreath is placed in front of the headstone, and the name is said out loud. Last year over 2.7 million wreaths were placed on headstones by volunteers.

It started in 1992, by Morrill Worcester of Maine and has grown every year. It is expected that this year will top 3 million wreaths. Volunteers


The Untold Story Of Operation Iraqi Freedom

OPEN SEASON Info for OPM.org

The 2023 Open Season is from November 13, 2023, through December 11, 2023. Annuitants may change health plans or options, cancel or suspend their FEHB enrollment, and request plan brochures and information by:

- · Using OPM's Open Season Online system
- Using Open Season Express by calling 1-800-332-9798.
- Sending regular mail (Postmarked no later than final date of Open Season) to: Office of Personnel Management Open Season Processing Center, PO Box 5000, Lawrence, KS 66046-0500.

When using the mail option, clearly state your Open Season request. If you are making an enrollment change, be sure to include the plan you want, the type of coverage (Self Only, Self plus one, or Self and Family), and the enrollment code. Add your Annuity Claim Number and Social Security Claim Number on your request. If you are choosing Self Plus One or Self and Family coverage, you will need to include your eligible family member's information and other insurance information as specified in the instructions mailed to you at the beginning of Open Season.

New Postal Service Health Benefits:

If you are happy with your current plan, DO NOTHING THIS YEAR. You may continue to participate in your current plan through December 31, 2024. Your first opportunity to select a plan under the new Postal Service health Benefits (PSHB) Program will be during Open Season in 2024. Coverage under the PSHB Program will begin January 1, 2025.

Are You A New Medicare Part B Participant?

If you have recently become eligible and enrolled in Medicare Part B, you are encouraged to take a look at the lower option in your current Plan. In most cases, your insurance representative will advise you to switch to the lower option with lower premiums, as Medicare becomes your primary insurance provider. All insurance carriers provide different benefits, and most provide a financial reimbursement to help offset the cost of Medicare Part B. Most plans cover all remaining expenses, including co-pays, after Medicare Part B pays the first and majority of expenses.
