Postmaster General stepping down.

Louis Dejoy, the 75<sup>th</sup> Postmaster General of the United States, relinquished his post on Monday March 24, 2025, just short of 5 years in the role. In his tenure the Postal Service saw significant changes in Delivery, Processing, and Logistics through implementation of the Delivering for America (DFA) plan. Many of us were affected by these changes with varying opinions of the individual outcomes. As Mr. Dejoy departed, he informed the Board of Governors that Doug Tulino, the current Chief Human Resources Officer (CHRO) and Deputy Postmaster General (DPMG) will step in until a permanent replacement is named.

Mr. Tulino has been a familiar face in Labor Relations, in Human Resources and as the DPMG. He is very knowledgeable about all aspects of postal operations. Mr. Tulino has addressed many of our National Executive Board sessions and several National Conventions. He is not a stranger to UPMA and has a long positive and engaging relationship with our organization. We look forward to working with him as we continue work towards improving and modernizing the Postal Service.
